

## **USING A REUSABLE WATER BOTTLE**

Bottling water takes a huge toll on our environment. Bottling water releases 2.5 million tons of carbon dioxide into the atmosphere annually and takes 17 million barrels of oil to produce a year's supply. That's enough oil to fuel 1.3 million cars for the year or power 190,000 homes! 38 billion water bottles end up in landfills each year. You may think that buying disposable water bottles and recycling them evens out the devastation they cause, but that is simply not the truth. 90% of the cost and eco emissions of bottling water come out of the creation of the bottle itself. Using a reusable water bottle lowers the amount of waste in landfills, protects animals and marine life and saves you hundreds of dollars a year.


