MIGRATION PILGRIMAGES

Come with Louise after church on the following Sundays, to see some of our natural neighbours on their fall migration.

November 3 at 12 pm – Come to Reifel Island Bird Sanctuary near Ladner. A good place for children to feed ducks and a good chance to see some of the 20,000 Snow Geese that spend the winter here.

November 17 – Eagle Festival at Harrison Mills, many organized activities including boat rides on the river. The salmon run attracts hundreds of eagles. This is the beginning of the peak period for eagles in the area.

December 1 – Another opportunity to see eagles.
