





Children are welcome at all services! It is important for families to worship together. Don't feel your child must be absolutely quiet or still, for we are glad to have children—and all their wiggles, giggles, and squiggles—as part of our community and worship life! After all... as an

old saying goes, "faith is caught, not taught!" Children are encouraged to stand and sing with the songs, partake in communion, read and pray along when they can, and join in for the "Early Word"—a time at the front with conversation just for them near the beginning of the service. Most Sundays September through June, we have "Children's Church" activities during the latter two-thirds of the service in the Lounge on the lower level, to which any pre-school through grade 5 aged child is welcome! For those accompanying infants or toddlers who need a spot to 'escape' to during the worship service, feel free to make use of the "Quiet Room" off the side of the sanctuary, near the piano, where there you will find comfortable seating, toys, and a changing table all while being able to hear and see the worship service.



Recording and streaming in use: Please note that video cameras and microphones are capturing our worship services, and that the resulting content may be transmitted over Zoom. YouTube, or other platforms.

Likewise, from time to time still photography of our worship services may be taken and used for church communications, websites, and other uses. By your presence within the sanctuary, you are indicating your consent to the possibility that your likeness may be captured and used in any of these ways. While video capture of congregants in the pews is relatively minimal, if you wish to guarantee you will not ever be depicted on video, the area at the rear centre of the pew seating area is unable to be picked up on camera.



Washrooms can be found just outside the sanctuary through the door at the front right of the space (the northeast corner of the room).



Thank you for *silencing cell phones* and other devices, and for refraining from flash photography.

Other news and notes

How One House in Korea Transformed The United Church of Canada: As part of The United Church of Canada's 100th anniversary, we are reflecting on a moment that reshaped us and our global partnerships. In 1974, the United Church transferred a mission house in Seoul to the Presbyterian Church in the Republic of Korea (PROK). What began as a



difficult conversation about ownership and power became a courageous act of decolonizing mission.

The house soon became an underground seminary during dictatorship and a centre for Minjung theology—a Korean liberation theology rooted in the struggle for democracy and human rights. PROK still cherishes the building, now a protected historic site.

faith. This experience underscores the urgency needed in the church: a pressing call to love others the way Jesus loved.

The United Church is at a critical moment. If we hope for a future presence, they argue we MUST risk changing our priorities, choosing accessibility and neighbours over comfort and familiarity. The decline is painful, but it is an

invitation to engage in the courageous, vulnerable work of self-reflection and transformation for God's dream.

God's Mission, Our Gifts

An Advent Lesson from Children: Last year, a small gift reminded us just how powerful generosity can be.

We received a cheque for \$125 from a longtime Mission and Service donor. But the money didn't come from her... it came from her three grandchildren. They had gathered loose change from around their house, rolling loonies, quarters, and dimes. They were told they could spend it on anything they wanted. Instead, they chose to send it all to help children in Ukraine.

Their letter said simply, "They decided to send it to help children in need." That story was a reminder



of something that already lives within us. We don't need to be taught how to care. God created us for compassion, and sometimes it takes the perspective of children to remind us of that.

That same spirit of generosity was powerfully echoed at General Council 45, where youth delegates from across the country shared their hopes for the church. They spoke of a church that is more than buildings, one that adapts boldly to God's call. They imagined a church that cares deeply about the world beyond its walls and is committed to real change. They envisioned a community that places the needs of the vulnerable first and uses its resources to serve others.

Their voices reflected the heart of Mission and Service: meeting people with compassion, supporting partners who respond to crises, and working for justice and healing in Canada and around the world.

The dreams of these young leaders, and the generosity of children who share what little they have, show the kind of future the church can build when people join their sparks together.

This Advent, Mission and Service invites the church to share sparks of compassion that can ignite fires of change. When generosity is passed from one person to another, it grows into comfort, hope, and lasting impact for those who need it most.
